# Activity Creation

## Activity One - Orla Owl Binoculars

1. Take two toilet rolls and stick them together with PVA glue, then let them dry.
  2. Wrap the rolls in paper, this makes it easier to decorate them.
  3. To make the straps for the binoculars, cut a small hole on the outside edge of each roll about 1.5cm from the top. Loop string through them and tie knots in the roll to secure.
  4. Now it's time to decorate and make them look as wacky as you like!
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## Activity Two - Memory Game

1. Cut paper into 20 pieces about the size of a mug.
  2. Decorate each piece of paper using animals or patterns.
  3. Put the pieces of paper into pairs and on each pair draw a different shape in the corner, this is so they can be used to match them up.
  4. Turn all the pieces over so they are blank side up, then try to find the pairs!
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## Activity Three - Homemade Bird Feeder

1. Take a clean bottle and just below the lid make two holes either side, then push a piece of string through and tie the two ends together. This will be used to hang your bottle.
  2. About 4cm from the bottom make another two more holes, then insert a stick all the way through, this is so birds can perch on it.
  3. About 4cm higher than the perch, make a feeding hole for the birds to access the food. The holes can be about 1cm wide, if it's much bigger the seeds will fall out.
  4. Now it's ready to decorate and hang up in the garden, keep an eye out for what birds you see!
